

Pittsburgh Fun Facts

1. The Discover Blog named The Andy Warhol Museum one of the top 10 coolest museums in the nation. Visit the museum and decide for yourself just how cool it is!
2. For you beer lovers, *Fodor's Travel* declared Pittsburgh one of the Best Craft Beer Cities in the U.S. Check out pittsburghbreweries.com and enjoy a glass today!
3. *USA Today* ranked the view of downtown Pittsburgh from atop Mt. Washington as one of "America's Most Stunning Views"! Scale the slopes via the historic Duquesne Incline from Station Square to Mt. Washington and see if you agree.
4. Pittsburgh is known as "The City of Bridges" with its 446 bridges located throughout the tri-state area. Tour the city by water aboard the Gateway Clipper Fleet to take in the close view of the Downtown skyline and a few of our bridges.
5. For you sports enthusiasts, take a walk down memory lane on Roberto Clemente Drive and visit the remaining Forbes Field Wall in Oakland. Forbes Field was a baseball park from 1909 to June 28, 1970. It was the third home of MLB Pittsburgh Pirates and the first home of NFL Pittsburgh Steelers. Its coordinates are 40.4412, 79.9533.
6. *Tribute to Children* is a nearly 11 foot bronze statue of Pittsburgh's favorite neighbor, Mister Fred Rogers, located near Heinz Field on the North Shore. This statue represents the final work of famed sculptor Robert Berks.

7. Pittsburgh is ranked as the 20th most bike friendly city in the U.S. but Bicycle Heaven on Pittsburgh's North Side is the world's largest bike museum. After viewing all of the bikes on display, rent a Healthy Ride bike at the various stations positioned around town and adventure out. You will find plenty of bike lanes throughout the city and you can access the trails too along the rivers.
8. Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hall and Museum is the largest memorial in the country dedicated to all branches of the military service and the building itself is a National Register of Historic Places landmark. Honor the brave soldiers and sailors of past and present with a visit.
9. Looking to satisfy a craving for some local famous food? Stop at one of Primanti Bros. locations around town to order one of their classic sandwiches (fresh Italian bread/house-made cole slaw/tomatoes/fresh cut fries/meat of choice/cheese). Arrive hungry but you will leave fully satisfied!
10. The Strip District is a one-half mile strip of land situated along the Allegheny River. This food/shopping district is full of ethnic grocers, produce stands, markets, and sidewalk vendors bursting with local flavor. Take a stroll and see what you will discover.
